

I identify these triads in SATB texture

 $\sharp$ :  $\text{III}^{\flat 4}$   
 (etc.)

C: I ii iii IV V vi vii

a: i ii III iv v VI VII vii

NB: The three similar chords in minor substitute for one another:  
 $\text{vii}^{\circ}$  and  $\text{IV}$  often.  
 $\text{III}$  for  $\text{vii}^{\circ}$  and  $\text{V}$  rarely.
