
In modulation, triads within a key attain the status of a new key.

(diatonic

↳ going to a stable (major or minor) triad in a key and making the root of that triad a new tonic.

chromatic

↳ (later)



B-flat
major: I ii iii IV V vi vii^o

I in major, the most common goal of modulation is I,
I in minor, the most common goal of modulation is III

B flat major: modulating from I to V with a pivot chord

↳ a triad that can function
in both I (B flat major)
and V (F major)

Bb major: I (Bb) ii (c) iii (d) IV (Eb) V (F) vi (g)

F major: I (F) ii (g) iii (a) IV (Bb) V (C) vi (d)
