- 6. Does the piece modulate to a frequently-occuring new key?
- 7. If so, what is the pivot sonority (provide the roman numerals of "old" and "new") and where does it occur?
- 8. What is the form of mm. 1-14?
- 9. Where precisely is the new tonic of the final cadence heard?
- 10. Are there any suspensions in mm. 1-14? If so what kind are they and where do they occur?
